AVID

Have you heard about AVID? AVID stands for "Achievement via Individual Determination." You may have heard of it at Gamble Rogers Middle School and at Pedro Menendez High School. AVID is a program that helps increases student learning through research-based methods and materials that help teachers provide effective instruction to their students in primary, secondary, and even post secondary education. AVID aligns itself with state educational standards and serves as an important strategy for closing the achievement gap and opening up the possibility of college attendance for all students. Just as Common Core Standards focus on helping students refine their reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening, and Language skills across the curriculum while at the same time challenging students as they move from one grade level to the next, so too does AVID with its focus on Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.

The Common Core Standards map out a "common" set of educational goals and objectives for ALL students across the nation, just as the AVID system is consistent across the nation. The Common Core Standards lay down a path for students to follow; AVID supports students as they follow that path to educational success.

AVID has been shared at our monthly School Advisory Council Meetings and teachers have gone to visit other schools where AVID has been implemented. During the 2013-14 school year, all Title I schools in St. Johns County will be implementing the program. We will be sharing a short presentation on AVID at our upcoming Spring Fling for parents to hear and learn more about how AVID supports ALL STUDENTS on their

FCAT READY!!!

This is an important week for our students in Grades 3-5. They are taking FCAT through Thursday. Please be sure your child gets a good nights rest, eats a good breakfast, and is at school by 8:25 AM each morning. We appreciate your support.

CALLING ALL PARENTS: JOIN THE LICE SQUAD

Our school is taking every measure possible to address the LICE incidents at school. Head lice is very contagious. They spread through the sharing of personal items such as combs, brushes, hats, scarves, sleeping bags, and even stuffed animals. Major outbreaks can be avoided if each parent will check his or her child now, and on a regular basis throughout the year.

Although lice are small and difficult to see with the naked eye, the eggs (nits) are fairly visible, especially at the back of the head behind the ears. They appear as small grayish-white bodies attached to individual hairs and can be mistaken for dandruff. Itching and scalp irritation are symptoms of an active case.

If you suspect your child has head lice please consult your family physician or pharmacist for treatment recommendations. Possible cases could be reported to the school so that other parents may be notified and so further infestations do not occur.

If you child is found to have lice, we will call the parents to come and pick up the child. You are encouraged to check your child now and at least several times monthly thereafter.

Dress Code

As warm spring days have arrived, we want to remind everyone of the dress code at South Woods. Please DO NOT send your child to school in sandals or backless shoes. This type of foot wear poses a safety risk to our young students. Shorts and dresses need to be fingertip length. Tank tops or short shirts that show the midriff and spaghetti strap tops are NOT appropriate for school wear.

Voluntary PreKindergarten (VPK) Registration

South Woods is <u>accepting applications for VPK</u> for the 2013-14 school year. Students eligible for the 2013-14 VPK Program must be age four on or before September 1, 2013 and must live in St. Johns County.

Parents must attend an Episcopal Children's Services (ECS) VPK Round Up to receive their certificate of eligibility. Proof of residency and your child's age will have to be presented in order to qualify for the VPK program. A certificate will be issued to you by ECS at the round up. Parents will surrender their VPK Certificate to schools only when they have been accepted. Parents will be contacted by the end of June.

VPK Roundup schedules can be viewed at http://www.ecs4kids.org/vpk_round_ups. Parents are advised to bring a photocopy of their child's birth certificate or blue Florida Shot Records (both sides), and a photocopy of proof of the parent's Florida residency showing your physical address.

At this time, we are able to offer bus transportation to all VPK students who spend a full day at school. VPK funds the morning portion while parents will need to pay \$50. a week or apply for substidized funds from Episcopal Children's Services. Registration is required ASAP so we can account for them on bus routes.

Head Start

A free Preschool program for low income families. Eligible children must be age 3 or 4 on or before September 1, 2013. Applications are being accepted every Tuesday from 9 to 11 AM. Applications are available in our school's front office. For more information, please call 547-4896.
